

Introduction script

Roughly 45 seconds read aloud. Cut it, reorder it, or put it in your own words — whatever sounds like you. The only request is the name: **Ravi** rhymes with *savvy*; **Bommireddipalli** is *bommi-REDDI-palli*.

Our next speaker has spent thirty years inside enterprise technology — not writing about it, running it.

He was Global CEO of Robosoft Technologies, a private-equity-backed firm he grew sevenfold, taking margins from negative to twenty percent. He now runs AyattAI, where he builds the Agentic AI systems he is about to talk about. Many of them are in enterprise production today.

He is an Electronics Engineer and holds an MBA from IIT Bombay, sits on the CEO Council of Tampa Bay, and is ranked among the top one percent of global design thinkers. He writes a newsletter called #RaviPOV on leadership in an AI-shaped organization. He is a student of ontology — a science that studies human beings.

His argument is a simple one, and it may be uncomfortable. AI has taken the “doing” or the “processing”. What it cannot take is the “human presence” and the “judgment” that decides which problems are worth solving — and the willingness to be answerable for the call.

A FEW NOTES

- He will mention that he runs an AI company once, in his own opening, because it is the source of his evidence. There is no product pitch in the talk, so no need to frame him as a vendor.
 - The talk opens with a show of hands. If you can leave the room lights up for the first two minutes, that helps.
 - He prefers to be introduced and left alone — no handoff questions, no on-stage interview unless the format is a fireside.
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
